






Central Region Juvenile Complaints Declined Significantly Over Ten Years

- Central Region complaints referred To DJS Intake declined 45% in ten years.
 - Statewide complaints declined 51% over the same period.
- Central Region complaints declined 49% Since FY08.
 - Statewide complaints declined 51% over the same period.




Central Region Juvenile Complaints Declined Significantly, While Overall Juvenile Population Remained Steady

- Central Region overall juvenile population has declined just 6% since FY05.
- Central Region complaints declined 45% over the same period.




Central Region Juvenile Complaints Have Declined in All Categories Over Ten Years

- Juvenile non-violent misdemeanors, which make up the greatest portion of offenses, dropped 43% between FY05 and FY14.
- Juvenile crimes of violence have declined 23% from FY05 to FY14.




The Proportion of Central Region Complaints Referred to Court Increased

- 56.1 % of Regional complaints were referred to court by DJS Intake in FY14, 10% more than in FY05. Statewide 53% were referred to court, up 10.7% since FY05.
- 14% of Central Region complaints were diverted to an informal DJS pre-court case, while Statewide 17.3% were diverted.




Although the Proportion of Cases Referred to Court is Up, the Overall Number Has Declined Over Ten Years

- In ten years the number referred to States Attorney for Formal Petition dropped 32%.
- The number of cases resolved declined 66%, and the number informally adjusted went down 50%.



Central Region Juvenile Detention Population Declined Significantly


- Central Region daily juvenile population in detention declined 45% in ten years, to just 36 in FY14. Statewide juvenile detained population declined 31% over the same period.
- Central Region pre-disposition detention ADP declined 44%.
- Central Region pending placement population declined 56%.



Note: In FY2014 DJS detention facilities began to hold more youth charged under adult court jurisdiction. Central Region had an ADP of just 1.6 youth held for the adult court. These are not reflected in the above chart.

Central Region Juvenile Probation and Commitment Orders Declined Somewhat Over Ten Years

- Juvenile probation orders dropped 26% in ten years, to 1,065 in FY14.
- Juvenile commitments have dropped 29% in ten years, to 268 in FY14.



Central Region Committed Youth Population Has Declined Significantly Over Ten Years

- Overall daily population of Central Region youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement declined 40%, from 207 in FY05 to 112 in FY14.
- Statewide daily population of youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement declined 26% over the same period.
