






Metro Region Juvenile Complaints Declined Significantly Over Ten Years

- Metro Region complaints referred To DJS Intake declined 48% in ten years.
- Statewide complaints declined 51% over the same period.




Metro Region Juvenile Complaints Declined Significantly, While Overall Juvenile Population Remained Steady

- Metro Region overall juvenile population has decreased just 1% since FY05.
- Metro Region complaints declined 48% over the same period.




Metro Region Juvenile Complaints Have Declined in All Categories Over Ten Years

- Juvenile non-violent misdemeanors, which make up the greatest portion of offenses, dropped 45% between FY05 and FY14.
- Juvenile crimes of violence have declined 34% from FY05 to FY14.




The Proportion of Metro Region Complaints Referred to Court Increased

- 48.7 % of Regional complaints were referred to court by DJS Intake in FY2014, 9.2% more than in FY05. Statewide 53% were referred to court, up 10.7% since FY05.
- 19.8% of Metro Region complaints were diverted to an informal DJS pre-court case, while Statewide 17.3% were diverted.




Although the Proportion of Cases Referred to Court is Up, the Overall Number Has Declined Over Ten Years

- In ten years the number referred to States Attorney for Formal Petition dropped 36%.
- The number of cases resolved declined 56%, and the number informally adjusted went down 57%.



Metro Region Juvenile Detention Population Has Increased


- Metro Region daily juvenile population in detention rose 30% in ten years, to 95 in FY14. Statewide juvenile detained population declined 31% over the same period.
- Metro Region pre-disposition detention ADP increased 44%.
- Metro Region pending placement population increased 9% in ten years.



Note: In FY2014 DJS detention facilities began to hold more youth charged under adult court jurisdiction. Metro Region had an ADP of just 1.6 youth held for the adult court. These are not reflected in the above chart.


Prince George's County Juvenile Detention Population Increased

- Prince George's county daily juvenile population in detention has more than doubled in ten years, though there has been a declining trend in the past two years. Statewide juvenile detained population declined 31% over the same period.
- Prince George's County Pre-Disposition detention ADP rose 150% in ten years.
- Prince George's county Pending Placement population increased significantly through FY12, but has declined 43% from that peak.




Montgomery County Juvenile Detention Population Has Greatly Decreased

- Montgomery county daily juvenile population in detention has declined 57% in ten years, from 36 to 16, with a very sharp drop pre-disposition population in FY214.




Metro Region Juvenile Probation Orders Declined Significantly. Committed Dispositions Remained Relatively Flat.

- Juvenile probation orders dropped 57% in ten years to 340 in FY14.
- Juvenile commitments have dropped 12% in ten years, to 292 in FY14.




Prince George's Juvenile Probation Orders Have Declined Over Ten Years, While Commitment Orders Have Increased

- Juvenile probation orders declined 67% in ten years, to 208 in FY14.
- Juvenile commitments increased 16% in ten years to 215 in FY14.




Montgomery County Juvenile Probation and Commitment Orders Have Declined Over Ten Years

- Juvenile probation orders declined 75% in ten years, to 132 in FY14.
- Juvenile commitments decreased 62% in ten years to 77 in FY14.




Metro Region Committed Youth Population Declined Slightly Over Ten Years

- Overall daily population of Metro Region youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement declined 15%, from 279 in FY05 to 238 in FY14.
- Statewide daily population of youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement declined 26% over the same ten year period.



Prince George's County Committed Youth Population Increased

- Overall daily population of County youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement rose 46%, from 125 in FY05 to 182 in FY14.
- Statewide average committed population declined 26% over the same period.



Montgomery County Committed Youth Population Decreased

- Overall daily population of County youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement declined 64%, from 154 in FY05 to 56 in FY14.
- Statewide average committed population declined 26% over the same period.
