


# Statewide, DJS Complaints Dropped 59% Since February 2020

DJS Statewide Complaints, July 2019-July 2020




# Detention ADP Declined 46% Between February and July 2020

Detention Avg. Daily Population (ADP), July 2019-June 2020




# March 3<sup>rd</sup> Statewide Detention Population




# July 31<sup>st</sup> Statewide Detention Population



# Failure to Appear/New Offenses Decline Among CD-EM Cases




# Violations and Arrests Drop Among Active Probation Cases





July 2019-July 2020



# Youth of Color Down Overall as Percent of Detention ADP


Percent YOC in Detention (Juvenile Pre-D, Pending Placement), July 2019-June 2020




