Committed Placement Information

A range of out-of-home program options (or placements) has been developed for committed youth. Community-based program options include placement in a Foster Home, Group Home, or Independent Living Program. Placements in non-community settings include Intermediate Care Facilities for Addictions (ICFA), Residential Treatment Centers (RTC), DJS-operated Youth Centers, and secure confinement facilities. DJS operates six facilities in Maryland and contracts with others both in-state and out-of-state.


