#### Intake Case Forwarding Decisions (FY 2020):

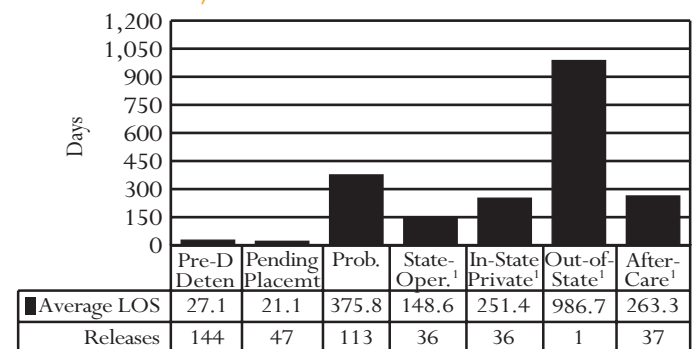

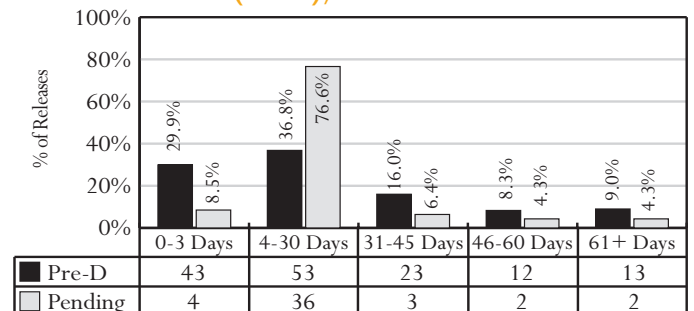

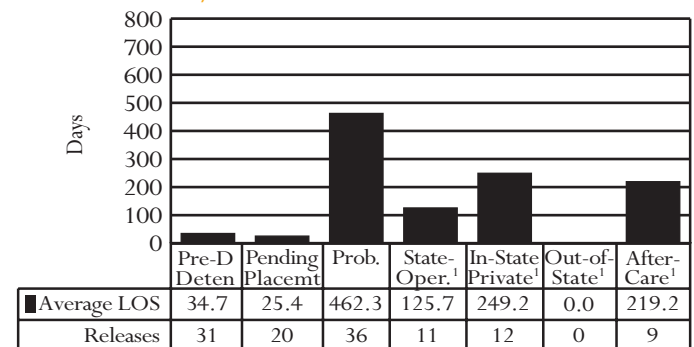

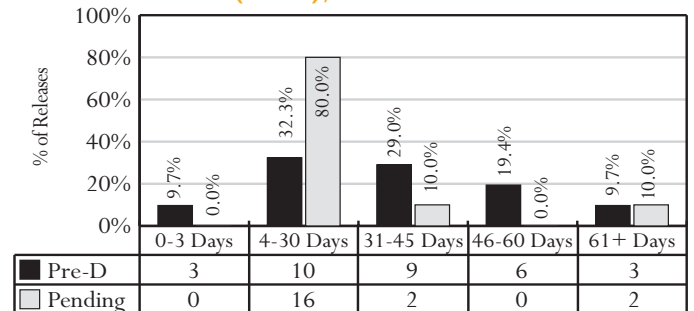

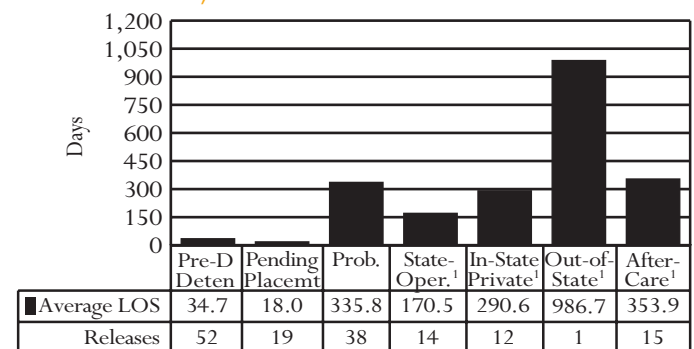

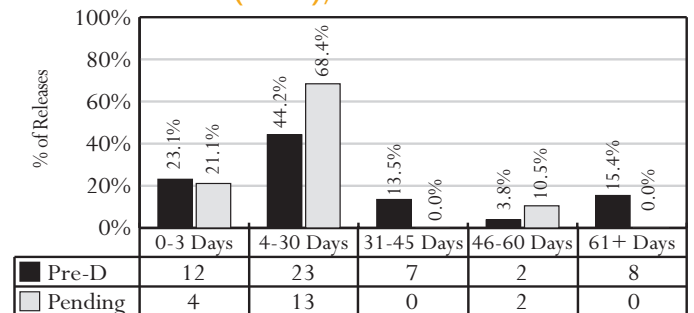

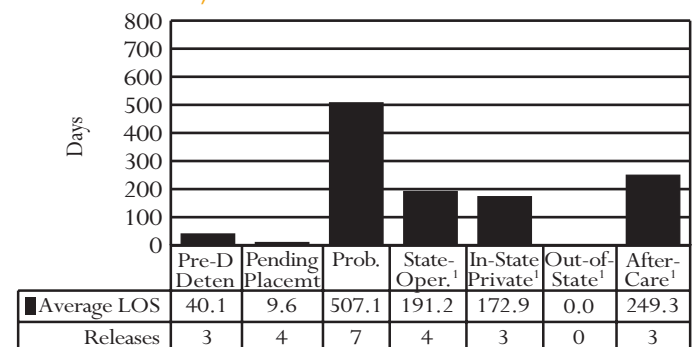

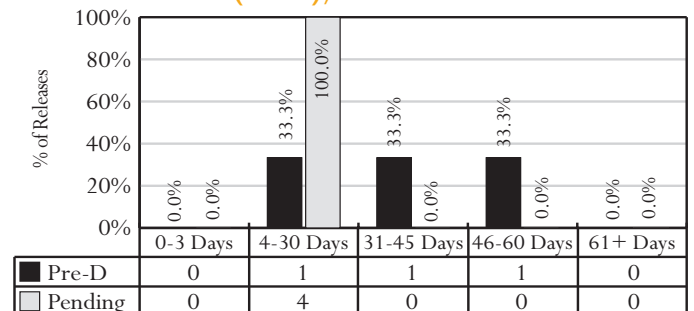

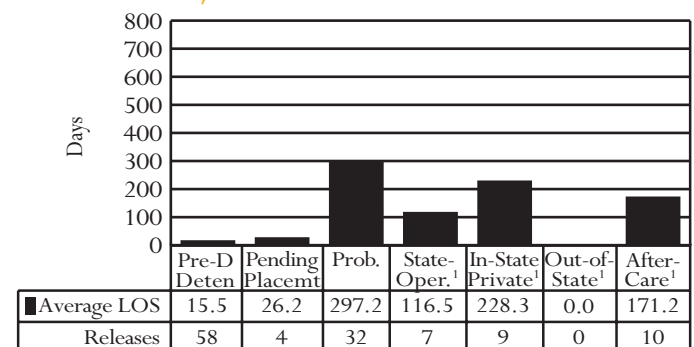

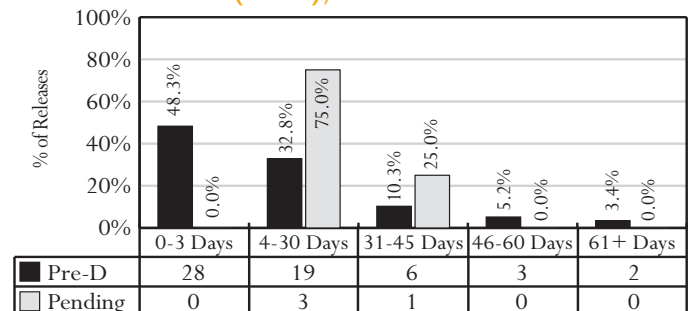
