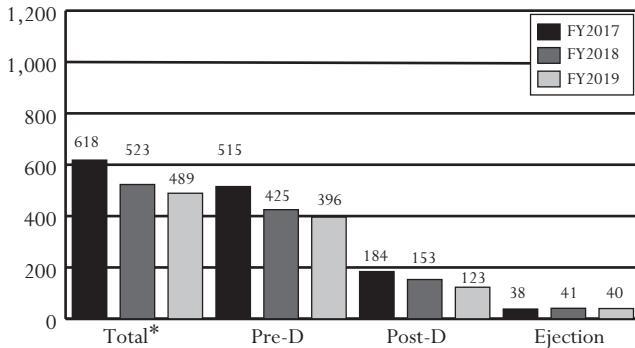

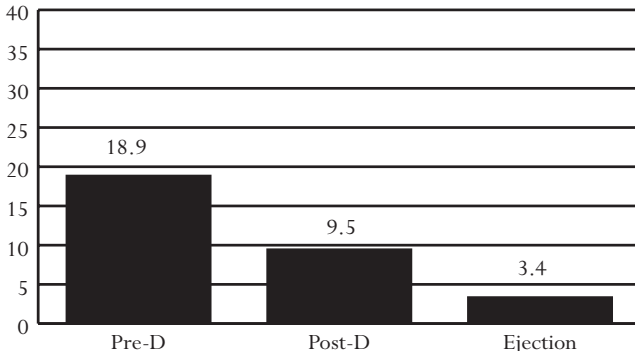

As of November 17, 2016, the facility changed from Cheltenham Youth Facility, which had a capacity of 115 beds.

#### Source of Admissions (FY 2019):

- 90.2% of admissions were from regions within Maryland. Of those from out of state, 46 were from Washington, D.C., and 1 each was from South Carolina and Virginia.

#### Admission Trends:

- Total admissions decreased 20.9% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 6.5% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Pre-D admissions decreased 23.1% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 6.8% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Post-D admissions decreased 33.2% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 19.6% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Ejection admissions increased 5.3% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 2.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

#### Detention Risk Assessment Instrument (DRAI):

- Pre-D admissions with a DRAI increased 6.1 percentage points between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 3.2 percentage points between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

#### Average Length of Stay (ALOS) in Days:

- For cases involving a transfer from facility to facility, the total ALOS is reflected on the statewide pages. The specific facility's page reflects only the ALOS at that particular facility.
- ALOS for Pre-D increased 15.6% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 24.1% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Post-D ALOS increased 34.5% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 32.7% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- ALOS for ejections decreased 9.2% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 21.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

#### Pre-D Offense Category (Most Serious Offense) Trends FY 2017-2019

- The percentage of Crimes of Violence increased from 36.7% to 44.2%.
- The percentage of Felonies increased from 11.3% to 12.4%.
- The percentage of Misdemeanors decreased from 44.7% to 39.1%.

#### Average Daily Population (ADP):

- Overall, ADP decreased 8.4% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 0.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Overall, ADP has consistently been below capacity.

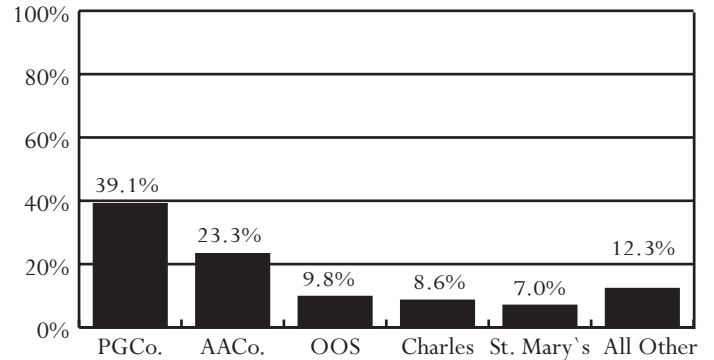

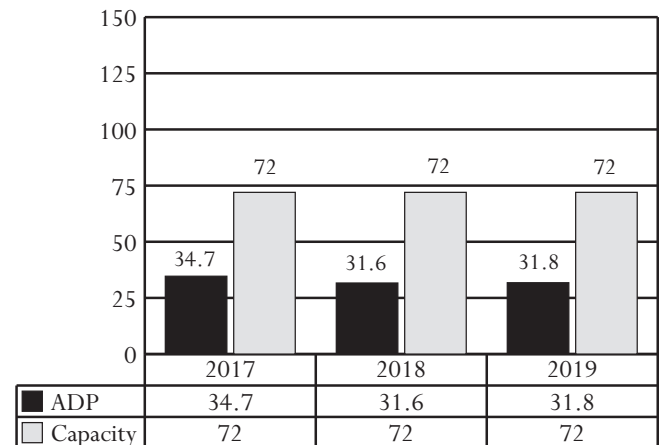
