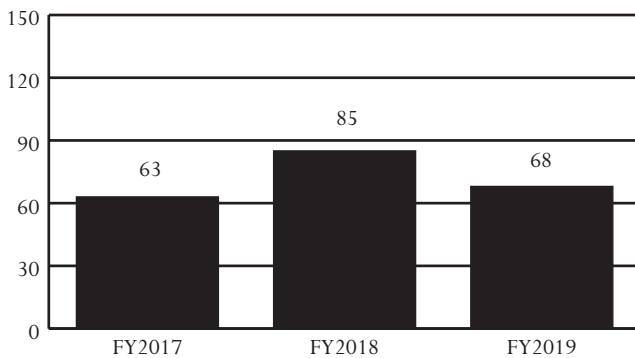

Built originally as a Civilian Conservation Corps Camp, Green Ridge Youth Center has had a variety of uses in its 90-year history. Currently, Green Ridge is a treatment center for males ages 13-18. The facility offers programming that includes the Seven Challenges drug treatment program and STARR, DJS' behavioral management program. Youth receive a Substance Use Assessment, and a level of care is determined. Green Ridge Youth Center is certified to offer Substance Abuse Early Intervention, Outpatient, and Intensive Outpatient Services. Drug treatment focuses on clinically managed low-intensity residential substance abuse treatment services. Youth participate in individual and group interventions. Family counseling is offered for every youth, as well as psychiatric services. Youth with chronic aggression are provided START: an evidence-based cognitive behavioral group intervention focused on developing youth's social skills, anger control, and moral reasoning. Regular family interaction is encouraged with visits, phone calls, family days, and family counseling. MSDE provides educational services on a 12-month schedule, with six hours of daily instruction five days a week in English, mathematics, science, social studies, health and life skills. Additionally, MSDE offers OSHA and ServSafe Certification, and individualized programs to prepare youth for the GED exam.

• Placement Trends:

- Placements increased 7.9% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 20.0% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

• Region of Residence (FY 2019):

- 97.1% of the placements were from regions within Maryland. The 2 from out of state were from Washington, D.C.

• Offense Type (FY 2019):

- The most common offense types for juveniles placed was Robbery (19.1%).

• Offense Category (FY 2018-2019):

- The percentage of Crimes of Violence increased from 30.6% to 38.2%.
- The percentage of Felonies decreased from 12.9% to 10.3%.
- The percentage of Misdemeanors decreased from 56.5% to 50.0%.

• Average Daily Population:

- ADP increased 11.2% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 5.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

• Average Length of Stay:

- The average LOS decreased 7.2% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 12.2% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

• Utilization Rate (FY 2018-FY 2019):

- Green Ridge Youth Center's utilization rate decreased from 80.5% in FY 2018 to 76.1% in FY 2019 (based on the facility's rated capacity).

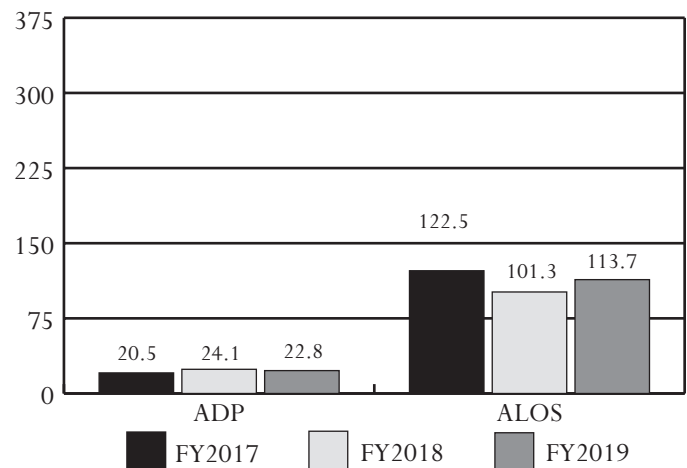

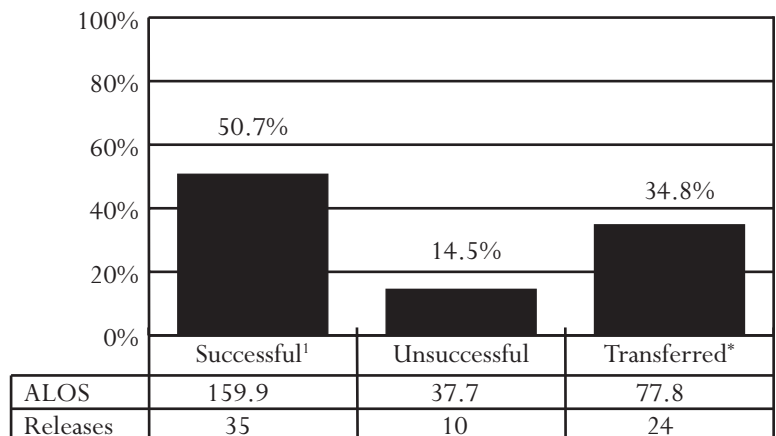
