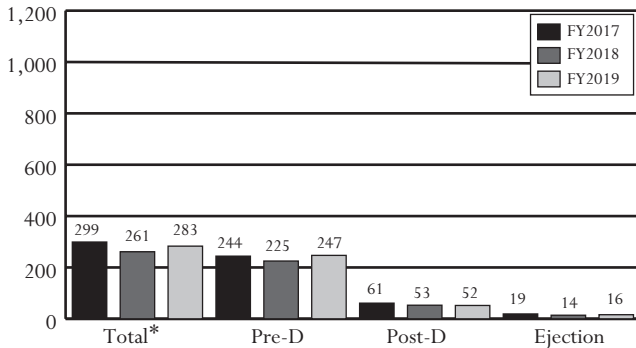

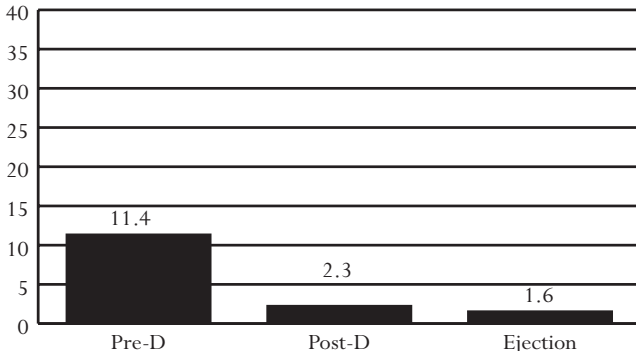

• Source of Admissions (FY 2019):

- 98.6% of admissions were from regions within Maryland. Of those from out of state, 2 were from Delaware, and 1 each was from Washington, D.C. and Ohio.

• Admission Trends:

- Total admissions decreased 5.4% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 8.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Pre-D admissions increased 1.2% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 9.8% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Post-D admissions decreased 14.8% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 1.9% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Ejection admissions decreased 15.8% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 14.3% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

• Detention Risk Assessment Instrument (DRAI):

- Pre-D admissions with a DRAI increased 2.1 percentage points between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 0.1 percentage points between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

• Average Length of Stay (ALOS) in Days:

- For cases involving a transfer from facility to facility, the total ALOS is reflected on the statewide pages. The specific facility's page reflects only the ALOS at that particular facility.
- ALOS for Pre-D increased 9.9% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 0.1% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Post-D ALOS increased 4.6% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and decreased 12.7% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- ALOS for ejections increased 8.4% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 43.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.

• Pre-D Offense Category (Most Serious Offense) Trends FY 2017-2019:

- The percentage of Crimes of Violence decreased from 23.8% to 21.1%.
- The percentage of Felonies increased from 14.3% to 15.4%.
- The percentage of Misdemeanors increased from 55.3% to 57.1%.

• Average Daily Population (ADP):

- Overall, ADP increased 5.9% between FY 2017 and FY 2019 and increased 5.4% between FY 2018 and FY 2019.
- Overall, ADP has consistently been below capacity.
- FY 2019 Pre-D ADP for males was 8.8 and for females was 2.7.
- FY 2019 Post-D ADP for males was 1.7 and for females was 0.6.
- FY 2019 Ejection ADP for males was 1.2 and for females was 0.3.

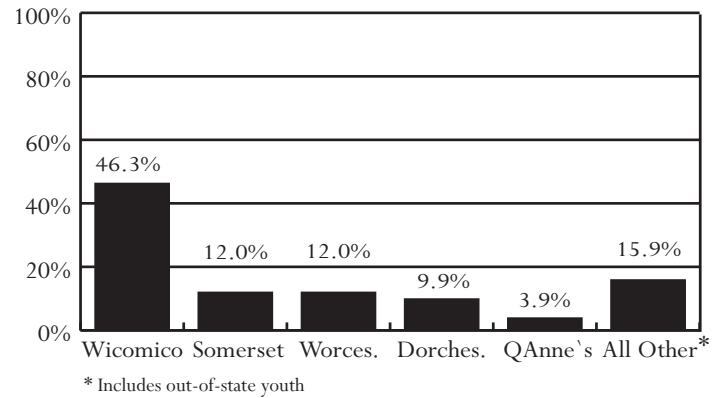

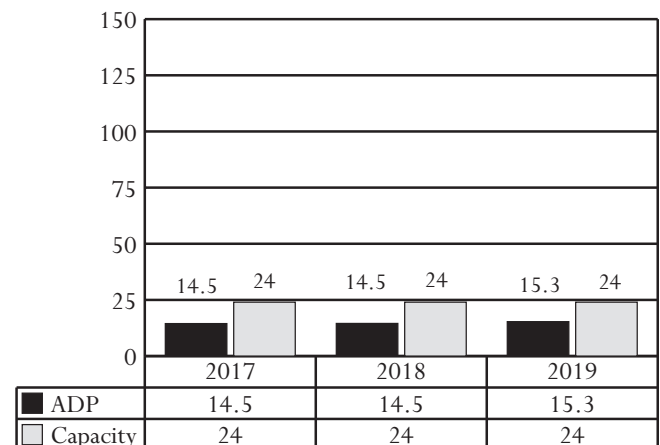
