

- Source of Admissions (FY 2024):
  - 98.2% of admissions were from Maryland jurisdictions. Of those from out of state, there were 9 from Washington, D.C.; and 1 each from Delaware and Pennsylvania.
- Average Length of Stay (ALOS) in Days:
  - For cases involving a transfer from facility to facility, the total ALOS is reflected on the statewide pages. The specific facility's page reflects only the ALOS at that particular facility.
- Pre-D Offense Category (Most Serious Offense) Trends FY 2022-2024:
  - The percentage of Crimes of Violence decreased from 52.0% to 46.6%.
  - The percentage of Felonies increased from 21.0% to 26.6%.
  - The percentage of Misdemeanors increased from 25.0% to 26.0%.
- Average Daily Population (ADP):
  - Overall, ADP increased 89.2% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and increased 40.1% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
  - Overall, ADP has consistently been below capacity.





#### ADP BY ADMISSION TYPE, FY 2022-2024




### PRE-D PLACEMENTS BY RISK LEVEL FOR YOUTH WITH A COMPLETED DRAI\*. FY 2022-2024
