

Green Ridge is a treatment program for males ages 13-18. Programming includes STARR, the DJS behavioral motivation program, and a complete array of evidence-based and Dialectical Behavior Therapy Services. Case Management and Behavioral Health staff provide treatment programming as detailed in the Behavioral Health & Case Management Services section (see page 135). Services are delivered via various modalities, including individual, group, and family sessions. Family engagement in treatment planning is paramount, as regular family interaction is encouraged through family visits, phone calls, special family day activities at the facility, and home visits to help youth successfully transition back to the community. - Placement Trends:
 - Placements increased 117.1% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and increased 20.6% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- *Residence (FY 2024):*
 - 96.1% of placements were Maryland residents. The three from out of state were from Washington, D.C.
- MCASP Risk Level (FY 2024):
 - For the 100.0% of placements with a post-validation MCASP, 34.2% were Very High Risk, 38.2% were High Risk, 19.7% were Moderate Risk, and 7.9% were Low Risk.
- Offense Category (FY 2023-2024):
 - The percentage of Crimes of Violence increased from 54.0% to 68.4%.
 - The percentage of Felonies decreased from 9.5% to 9.2%.
 - The percentage of Misdemeanors decreased from 36.5% to 22.4%.
 - See the Terms and Concepts pages in Appendix R for an explanation of Crime of Violence, Felony, and Misdemeanor, as the definitions are helpful when examining offense severity.
- Average Daily Population (ADP):
 - ADP increased 104.8% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and increased 26.0% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- Average Length of Stay (ALOS):
 - ALOS increased 0.4% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and increased 17.0% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- *Utilization Rate (FY 2023-FY 2024):*
 - Green Ridge Youth Center's utilization rate increased from 71.4% in FY 2023 to 90.0% in FY 2024.




