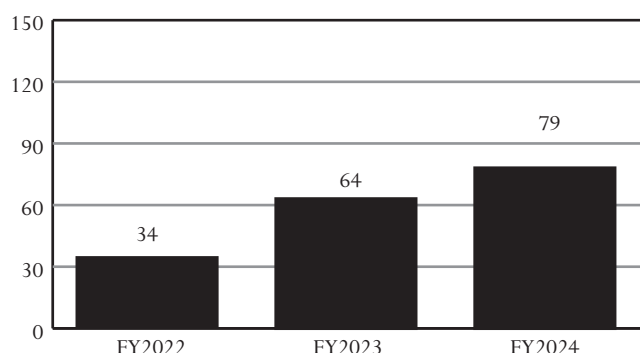
Capacity: 27 Males (Facility became male only on 12/2/2023.)

The Victor Cullen Center (VCC) is a hardware-secure treatment program, primarily serving youth ages 15-21 in a six- to nine-month treatment program for mental health and/or substance abuse issues. Programming includes STARR, the DJS behavioral motivation program, and a complete array of evidence-based and -informed treatment services. Case Management and Behavioral Health staff provide treatment programming as detailed in the Behavioral Health & Case Management Services section (see page 135). Services are delivered via various modalities, including individual, group, and family sessions. Family engagement in treatment planning is of paramount importance. Regular family interaction is encouraged through family visits, phone calls, special family day activities at the facility, and home visits to help youth successfully transition back to the community. Recreational programming includes camping and intramural sports. Specialized programs include Yoga and Mindfulness Training, and arts-based programs. - **Placement Trends:**
  - Placements increased 132.4% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and increased 23.4% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- **Residence (FY 2024):**
  - 98.7% of placements were Maryland residents. The one from out of state was from Washington, D.C.
- **MCASP Risk Level (FY 2024):**
  - For the 100.0% of placements with a post-validation MCASP, 24.1% were Very High Risk, 25.3% were High Risk, 35.4% were Moderate Risk, and 15.2% were Low Risk.
- **Offense Category (FY 2023-2024):**
  - The percentage of Crimes of Violence increased from 64.1% to 75.9%.
  - The percentage of Felonies decreased from 17.2% to 11.4%.
  - The percentage of Misdemeanors decreased from 18.8% to 12.7%.
  - See the Terms and Concepts pages in Appendix R for an explanation of Crime of Violence, Felony, and Misdemeanor, as the definitions are helpful when examining offense severity.
- **Average Daily Population (ADP):**
  - ADP increased 94.0% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and increased 9.4% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- **Average Length of Stay (ALOS):**
  - ALOS decreased 20.0% between FY 2022 and FY 2024 and decreased 10.0% between FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- **Utilization Rate (FY 2023-FY 2024):**
  - Victor Cullen Center's utilization rate increased from 84.1% in FY 2023 to 88.5% in FY 2024.

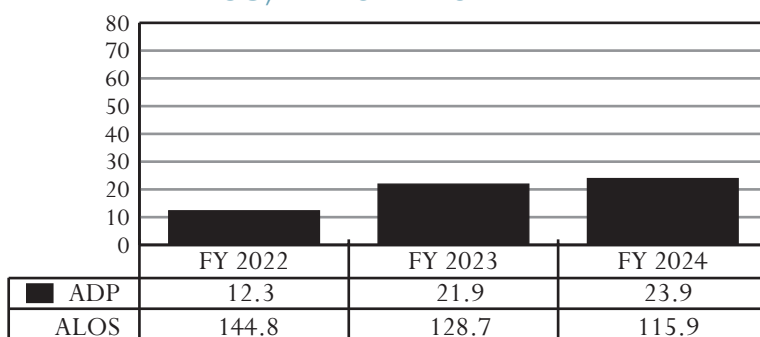

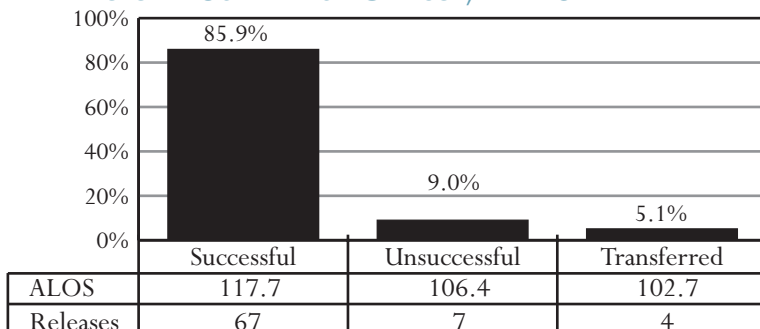
