

# Overall Recidivism Rates for Treatment Program Releases for Youth with Sustained Offenses Originally Transferred from Adult Court Jurisdiction

The data on this page represent recidivism rates for youth who have been released from a committed treatment program who had a previous charge transferred from adult court jurisdiction which was found sustained by the juvenile court. These are a subset of the overall treatment program release recidivism cohort as shown in the DJS Data Resource Guide Fiscal Year 2021. The data sources and methodology are identical to those outlined there.

- Males had higher recidivism rates than females for all measures though it is important to note that there were only 2 female releases in FY 2019. Neither recidivated during the tracking period.
- Black youth had the highest rates for rearrest, reconviction and reincarcerations.
- Some age groups comprise a small number of youth. Therefore, the reoffense of a few can strongly influence the overall rate. For this reason, caution should be used when attempting to compare age groups.

The data on this page represent recidivism rates for youth with juvenile court probation dispositions resulting from charges that had been transferred from original adult court jurisdiction. These are a subset of the overall probation recidivism cohort as shown in the DJS Data Resource Guide Fiscal Year 2021. The data sources and methodology are identical to those outlined there.

- Between FY 2018 and FY 2020, the 12-month rearrest rate decreased 16.6 percentage points.
- Between FY 2018 and FY 2019, the 12-month reconviction rate decreased 7.2 percentage points and the 12-month incarceration rate decreased 5.9 percentage points.

- Some age groups comprise a small number of youth. Therefore, the reoffense of a few can strongly influence the overall rate. For this reason, caution should be used when attempting to compare age groups.

<sup>\*</sup> Since the probation cohort includes youth who may not have been previously placed in a treatment program, "incarceration" reflects a subsequent commitment to an out-of-home placement or incarceration in the adult system.
