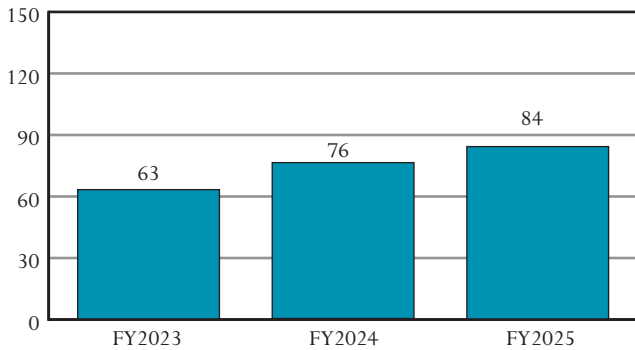

Green Ridge is a treatment program for males. Programming includes STARR, the DJS behavioral motivation program, and a complete array of evidence-based and Dialectical Behavior Therapy Services. Case Management and Behavioral Health staff provide treatment programming as detailed in the Behavioral Health & Case Management Services section (see page 135). Services are delivered via various modalities, including individual, group, and family sessions. Family engagement in treatment planning is paramount, as regular family interaction is encouraged through family visits, phone calls, special family day activities at the facility, and home visits to help youth successfully transition back to the community. • Placement Trends:

- Placements increased 33.3% between FY 2023 and FY 2025 and increased 10.5% between FY 2024 and FY 2025.

• Residence (FY 2025):

- 98.7% of placements were Maryland residents. The one from out of state were from Washington, D.C.

• MCASP Risk Level (FY 2025):

- For the placements with a post-validation MCASP, 27.4% were Very High Risk, 33.3% were High Risk, 28.6% were Moderate Risk, and 10.7% were Low Risk.

• Offense Category (FY 2024-2025):

- The percentage of Crimes of Violence decreased from 61.8% to 47.6%.
- The percentage of Felonies decreased from 14.5% to 8.3%.
- The percentage of Misdemeanors increased from 23.7% to 44.0%.
- See the Terms and Concepts pages in Appendix R for an explanation of Crime of Violence, Felony, and Misdemeanor, as the definitions are helpful when examining offense severity.

• Average Daily Population (ADP):

- ADP increased 10.1% between FY 2023 and FY 2025 and decreased 12.6% between FY 2024 and FY 2025.

• Average Length of Stay (ALOS):

- ALOS decreased 8.0% between FY 2023 and FY 2025 and decreased 21.3% between FY 2024 and FY 2025.

• Utilization Rate (FY 2024-FY 2025):

- Green Ridge Youth Center's utilization rate decreased from 90.0% in FY 2024 to 78.7% in FY 2025.

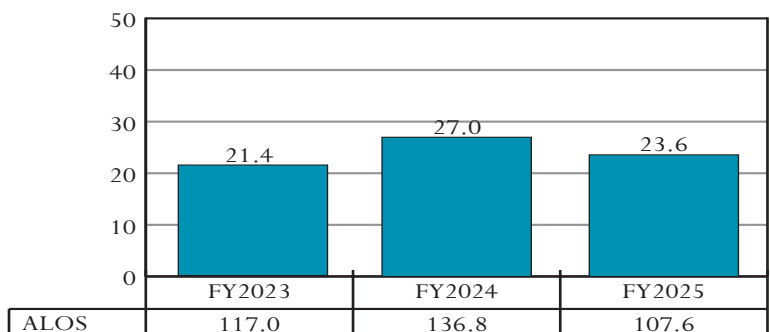

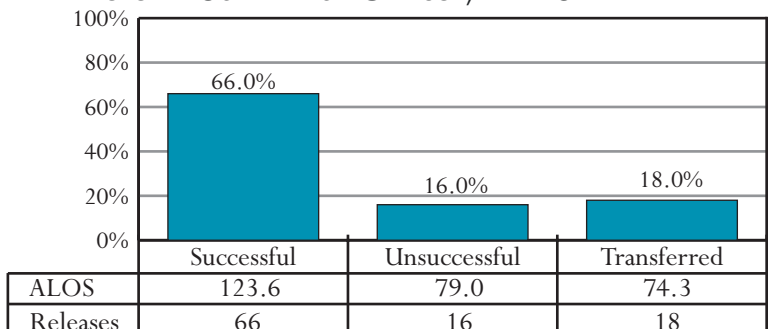
