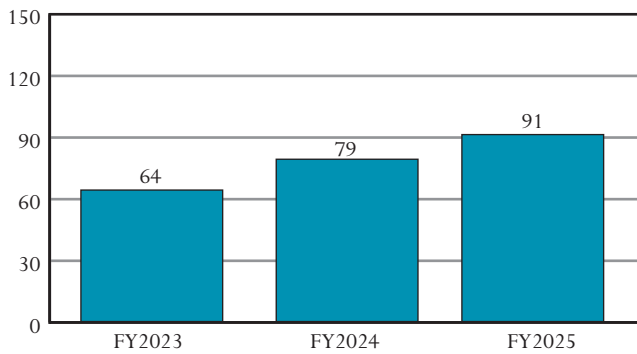

The Victor Cullen Center (VCC) is a hardware-secure treatment program, primarily serving youth ages 15-21 in a six- to nine-month treatment program for mental health and/or substance abuse issues. Programming includes STARR, the DJS behavioral motivation program, and a complete array of evidence-based and -informed treatment services. Case Management and Behavioral Health staff provide treatment programming as detailed in the Behavioral Health & Case Management Services section (see page 135). Services are delivered via various modalities, including individual, group, and family sessions. Family engagement in treatment planning is of paramount importance. Regular family interaction is encouraged through family visits, phone calls, special family day activities at the facility, and home visits to help youth successfully transition back to the community. Recreational programming includes camping and intramural sports. Specialized programs include Yoga and Mindfulness Training, and arts-based programs. • Placement Trends:

- Placements increased 42.2% between FY 2023 and FY 2025 and increased 15.2% between FY 2024 and FY 2025.

• Residence (FY 2025):

- 98.9% of placements were Maryland residents. The one from out of state was from Virginia.

• MCASP Risk Level (FY 2025):

- For the placements with a post-validation MCASP, 28.6% were Very High Risk, 29.7% were High Risk, 20.9% were Moderate Risk, and 20.9% were Low Risk.

• Offense Category (FY 2024-2025):

- The percentage of Crimes of Violence increased from 70.9% to 76.9%.
- The percentage of Felonies decreased from 13.9% to 8.8%.
- The percentage of Misdemeanors decreased from 15.2% to 14.3%.

• Average Daily Population (ADP):

- ADP increased 14.7% between FY 2023 and FY 2025 and increased 4.8% between FY 2024 and FY 2025.

• Average Length of Stay (ALOS):

- ALOS decreased 19.8% between FY 2023 and FY 2025 and decreased 10.9% between FY 2024 and FY 2025.

• Utilization Rate (FY 2024-FY 2025):

- Victor Cullen Center's utilization rate increased from 88.5% in FY 2024 to 93.0% in FY 2025.

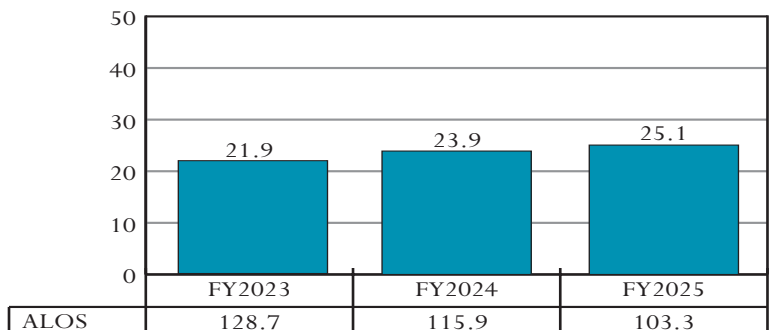

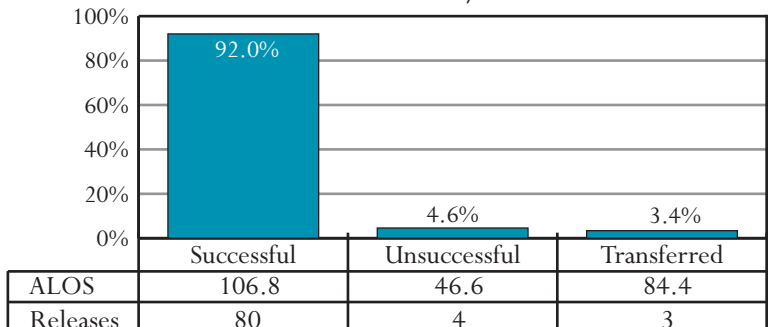
