




Statewide, DJS Complaints Dropped 59% Since February 2020

DJS Statewide Complaints, July 2019-July 2020




Detention ADP Declined 46% Between February and July 2020


Detention Avg. Daily Population (ADP), July 2019-June 2020




March 3rd Statewide Detention Population Total Juvenile Population - 108


July 31st Statewide Detention Population Total Juvenile Detained Population - 43








Failure to Appear/New Offenses Decline Among CD-EM Cases




Violations and Arrests Drop Among Active Probation Cases




Commitment ADP Down 48% Since Feb. 2020

Commitment ADP - Overall, DJS-Operated, and Private (In- and Out-of-State), July 2019-July 2020




Reentry From Commitment Cases Show Declines in Arrests/Violations of Probation



Youth of Color Down Overall as Percent of Detention ADP


Percent YOC in Detention (Juvenile Pre-D, Pending Placement), July 2019-June 2020




