- Between July 2018 and July 2022, the Region 2 population (ages 11-17) increased 0.3% (from 21,147 to 21,205).

#### Intake Case Forwarding Decisions (FY 2023):

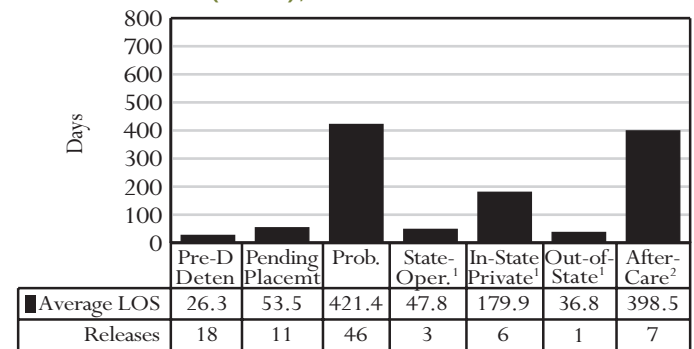

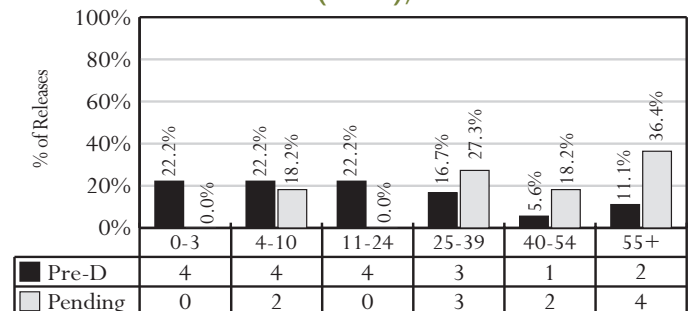
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

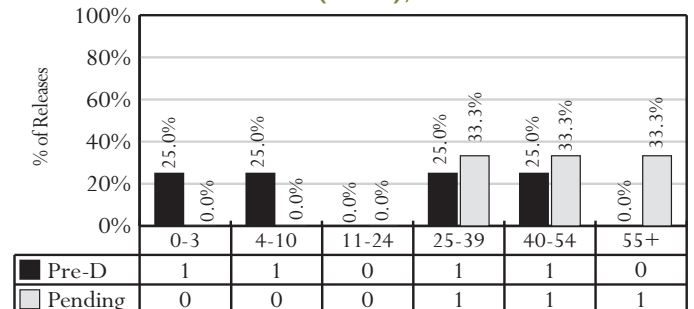

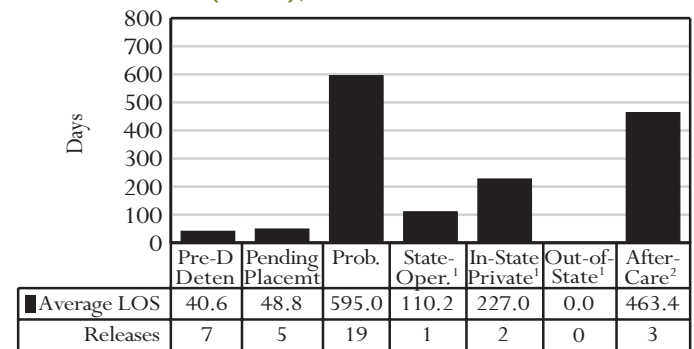

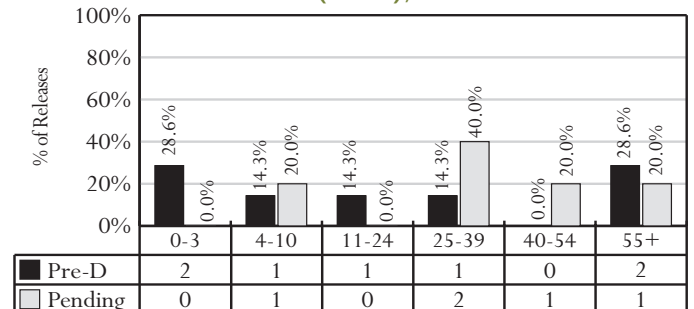
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

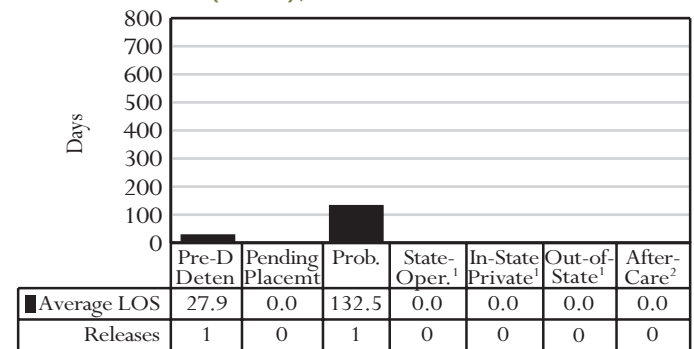

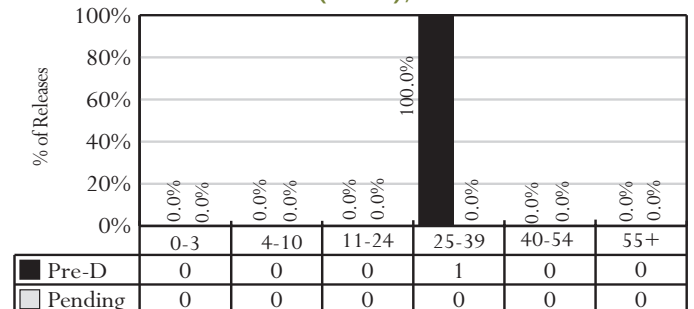
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

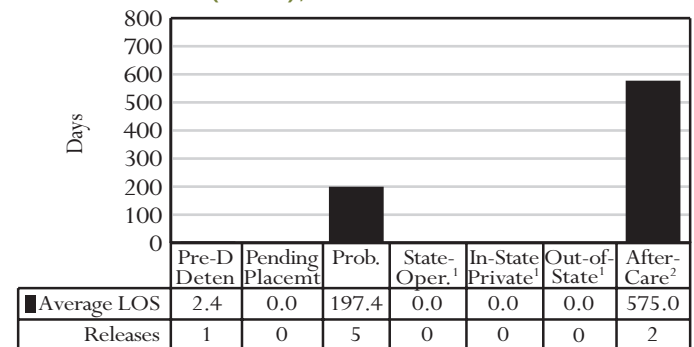

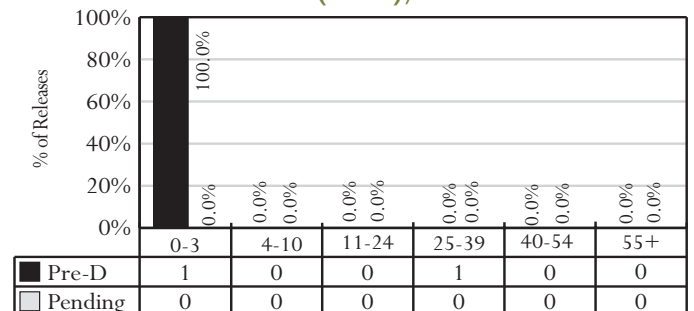
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

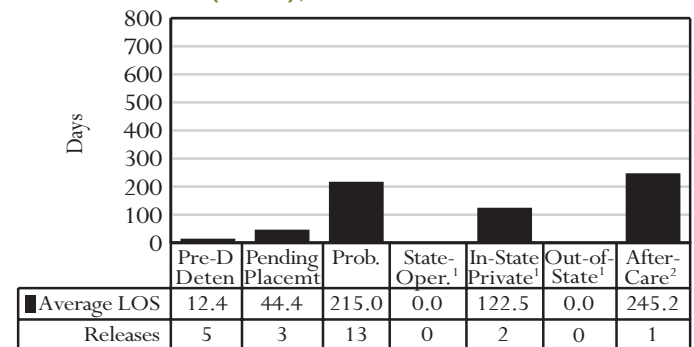

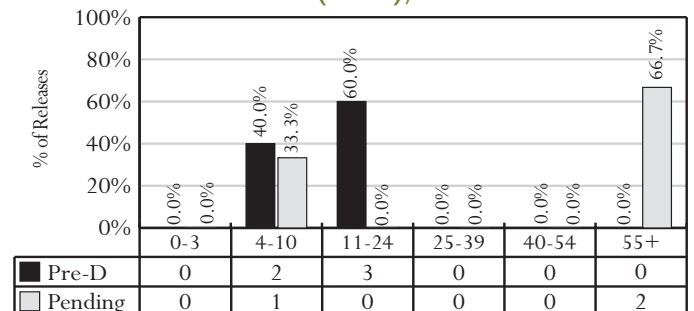
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES
