#### • U.S. Census and Maryland Department of Planning Estimation Data:

- Between July 2018 and July 2022, the Region 3 population (ages 11-17) increased 5.8% (from 94,411 to 99,897).

#### • Intake Case Forwarding Decisions (FY 2023):

- 38.1% of complaints were formalized, while 6.6% were informaled.

#### • Intake Trends (FY 2021-2023):

- Total complaints increased 68.0%.
- The percentage of total complaints authorized for formal petition decreased from 43.4% to 38.1%.

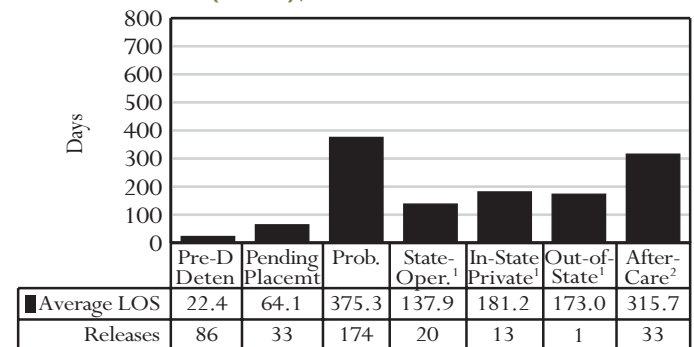

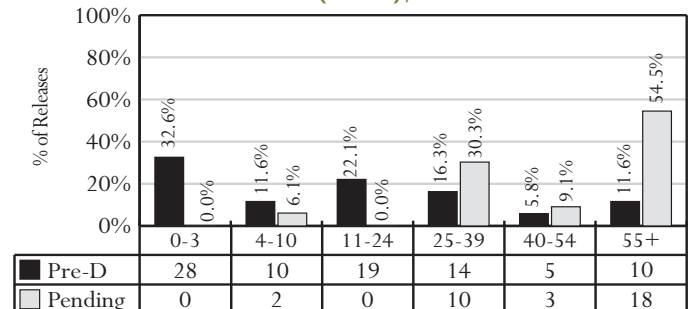
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

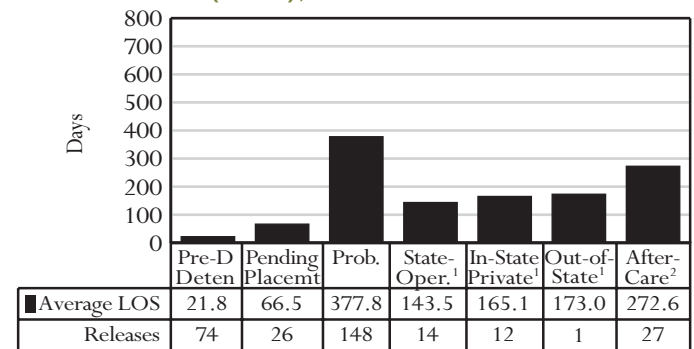

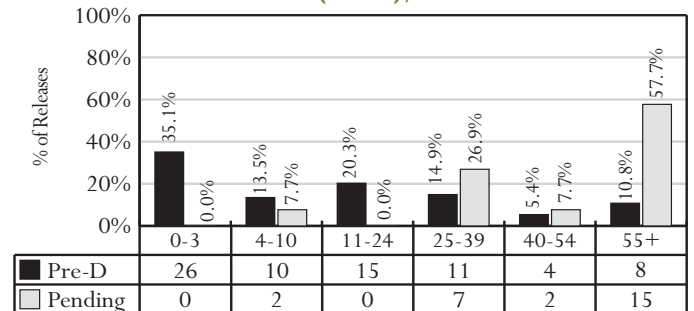
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

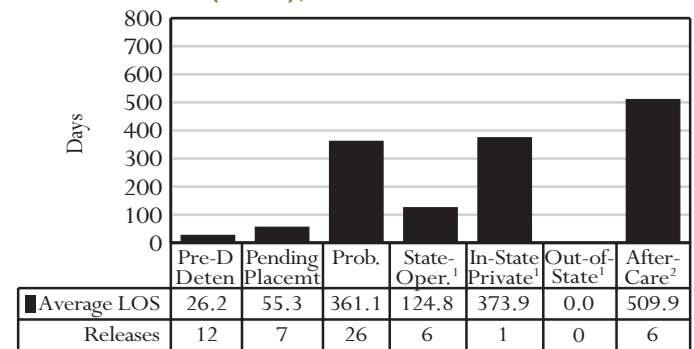

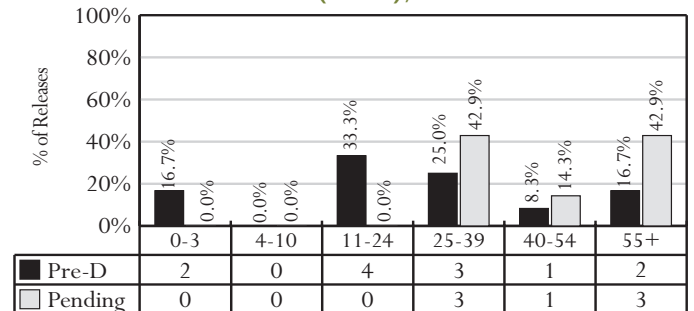
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES
