- Between July 2018 and July 2022, the Region 6 population (ages 11-17) increased 4.6% (from 117,721 to 123,086).

#### Intake Case Forwarding Decisions (FY 2023):

- 40.1% of complaints were formalized, while 18.0% were informaled.

#### Intake Trends (FY 2021-2023):

- Total complaints increased 114.5%.
- The percentage of total complaints authorized for formal petition decreased from 52.9% to 40.1%.

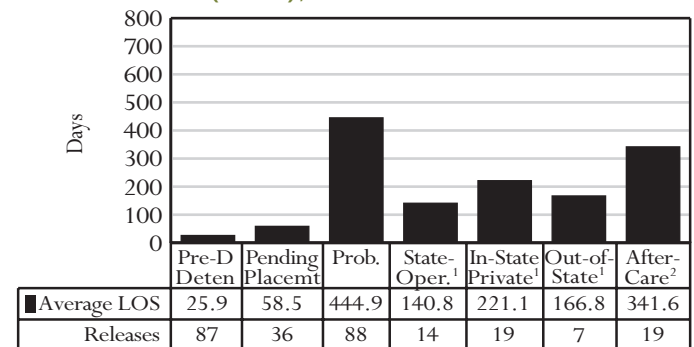

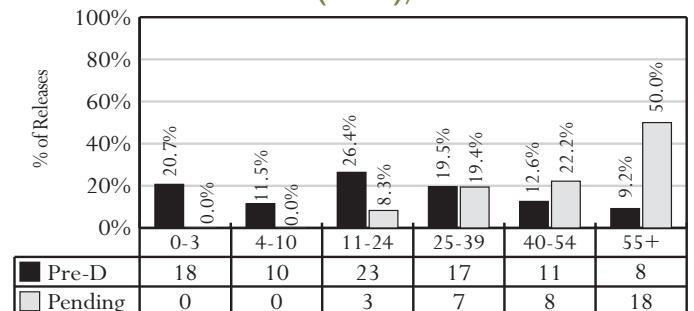
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

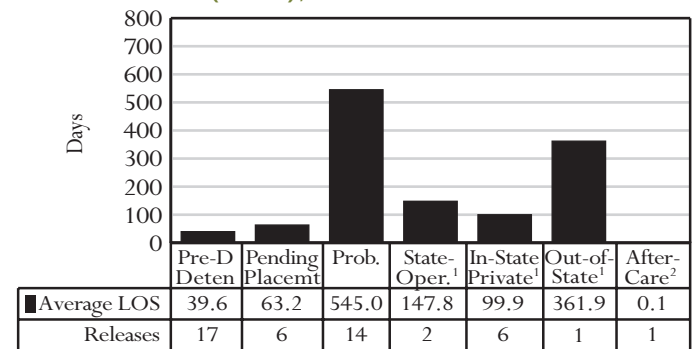

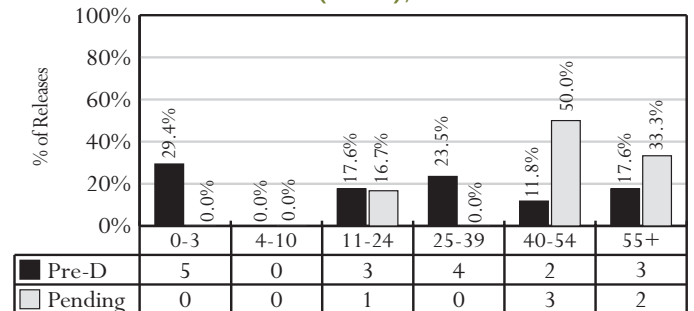
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES

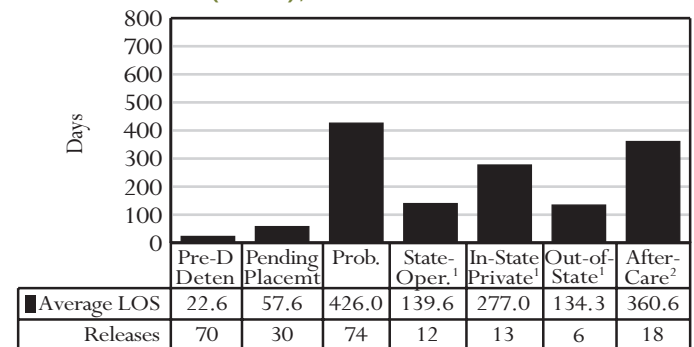

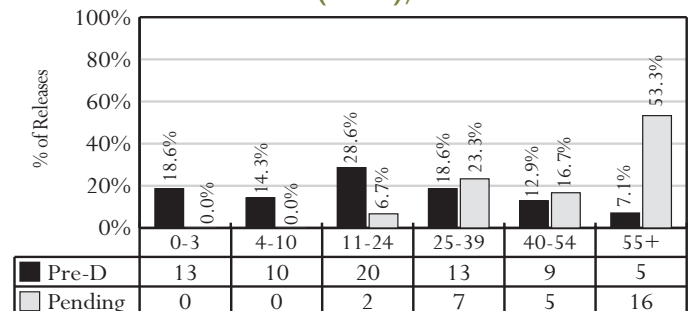
## AVERAGE LOS (DAYS), FY 2023 RELEASES
