I. POLICY

The Department of Juvenile Services (DJS) shall ensure all youth participation in biomedical research is consistent with established ethical, medical, legal, and regulatory standards for human research.

I. PURPOSE

To provide a systematic and coordinated process to review, approve and document DJS youth participation in health-related research, and to ensure that research in DJS facilities occurs only after obtaining proper consent of youth, and/or legal guardian, as required by law, and approval by DJS and the requesting research investigator's facility's Institutional Review Board (IRB).

II. DEFINITIONS

Informed consent is the written agreement by a patient or guardian to a treatment, examination, or procedure after the patient or guardian receives the material facts about the nature, consequences, and risks of the proposed treatment, examination, or procedure; the alternatives to it; and the prognosis if the proposed intervention is or is not undertaken.

Qualified Health Care Professional includes licensed physicians, physician's assistants, dentists, nurses, nurse practitioners, mental health professionals and others who by virtue of their education, credentials, and experience are permitted by law to evaluate and care for youth.

III. PROCEDURES

- A. All youth participation in research shall be reviewed and approved in accordance with the *DJS Review and Approval of Research Proposals Policy*.
- B. Any research conducted on youth shall meet the standards for research design and control.
- C. As required by law, the investigating research facility's IRB, the DJS Research Committee, the youth and/or their legal guardian must give informed consent in order to participate in any research conducted on the youth while in DJS facilities.

- 1. Signatory shall be determined based on who (youth or parent) is legally allowed to consent.
- 2. Invasive procedures or treatment where there is a risk or benefit to the youth require informed consent documented on a written form containing the signatures of the youth or legal guardian as required by law, and health staff witness.
- 3. Any refusal shall be documented and must include the following:
 - a. A description of the nature of the service being refused; and
 - b. Evidence that the youth has been made aware of any adverse consequence to their health that may occur because of the refusal.
- D. If a DJS youth is a participant in a community or hospital-based research study or clinical trial prior to admission to a DJS facility, then DJS staff will consult with the research or clinical investigators to continue, modify, hold, or terminate participation in the research study or trial depending on the safety and feasibility of continuing the research or clinical protocol while in a DJS facility. If a youth's health could be negatively affected by termination or modification to his or her participation in a research study or clinical trial, then DJS shall work with the research or clinical investigators whenever possible to continue participation or otherwise safely modify or withdraw participation in the research study or clinical trial.
- E. DJS qualified health care professionals shall not prescribe, dispense, or administer experimental medication, substances, or other experimental treatment modalities to DJS youth unless as part of an approved research study or clinical trial after obtaining informed consent by the youth and/or legal guardian as required by law, Institutional Review Boards, and the DJS Research Committee. DJS qualified health care professionals shall operate within the bounds of their license(s) and shall follow health practices that are accepted by the medical/health community.
- F. DJS youth shall not be used for medical, pharmaceutical, or cosmetic experiments. This does not preclude individual treatment of a youth based on his or her need for a specific medical procedure that is not generally available.
- G. Clinical research aimed at improving the care or condition of confinement is not prohibited. Institutions electing to perform research shall be in compliance with all state and federal guidelines.
- H. Youth in DJS facilities shall not be forced or coerced to participate in research studies and shall not be subject to negative consequences if they decline to participate in health-related research.

VII. RESPONSIBILITY

The Medical Director is responsible for implementation and compliance with this procedure.

VIII. <u>INTERPRETATION</u>

The Deputy Secretary of Operations shall be responsible for interpreting and granting any exceptions to these procedures.
