


Baltimore City Juvenile Services Long Term Trends

Baltimore City Juvenile Complaints Have Declined Significantly


- Baltimore City complaints referred to DJS Intake declined 66% in ten years.
- Statewide complaints declined 51% over the same period


Baltimore City Juvenile Complaints Declined Significantly, While The Overall Juvenile Population Has Remained Level

- Baltimore City overall juvenile population increased 4% since FY05.
- Baltimore City juvenile complaints referred to DJS declined 66% over the same period.



Baltimore City Juvenile Complaints Have Declined in All Categories Except Crimes of Violence


- Juvenile non-violent misdemeanors, which make up the greatest portion of offenses, dropped 67% between FY05 and FY14.
- Juvenile crimes of violence have increased slightly (6%) from FY05 to FY14.

Cases Referred to the Juvenile Court by DJS Intake Have Declined Significantly in Ten Years


- The number referred to States Attorney for formal petition decreased 54%.
- The number of cases resolved declined 89%, and the number informally adjusted decreased 66%.

The Proportion of Baltimore City Complaints Referred to Court Increased


- 83.9% of Baltimore City complaints were referred to court by DJS Intake in FY14,
 21.8% more than in FY05. Statewide 53% were referred to court, up 10% since FY05
- 6.1% of Baltimore City complaints were diverted to an informal DJS pre-court case, virtually unchanged from FY05. Statewide 18% were diverted to an informal DJS precourt case

Baltimore City Detention Population Declined Significantly


- Baltimore City daily juvenile population in detention declined 47% in ten years, to 76 in FY14. The statewide population declined 31% over the same period.
- Baltimore City Pre-Disposition ADP declined 43% in ten years, and 50% since FY10.
- Baltimore City Pending Placement population declined 55% in ten years and 68% since FY10.
- In FY14 DJS began to hold significant numbers of cases (ADP:30) for the Adult Court.

Juvenile Probation and Commitment Orders Have Declined


- Baltimore City Juvenile probation orders declined 46% in ten years. Statewide probation orders declined 38% over the same period.
- Baltimore City juvenile commitments declined 38% in ten years. Statewide commitments declined 34% over the same period.

Baltimore City Committed Youth Population Has Declined

- Overall daily population of Baltimore City youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement declined 33% over ten years, from 243 in FY05 to 163 in FY14.
- Statewide average committed population declined 26% over the same period.
