



Counties of Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and Worcester


Eastern Region Juvenile Complaints Have Declined Significantly Over Ten Years

- Complaints Referred To DJS Eastern Region Intake Declined 50% in Ten Years, and 35% since FY2009
- Statewide Complaints Declined 48% over ten years and 43% since FY2009




The Proportion of Eastern Region Complaints Referred to Court Has Increased

- 37.3% of Eastern Region complaints were referred to court by DJS Intake in FY13, 7% more than in FY09 Statewide 52% were referred to court, up 10% since FY09
- 23.1% of Eastern Region complaints were diverted to an informal DJS pre-court case, down 2.8% since FY09 Statewide 17.8% were diverted, up just 0.2% since FY09



Eastern Region Detention Population Has Declined Slightly Since FY2010

- Overall daily population in detention declined 13% in four years, to 28.1 in FY13
 Statewide Population Declined 16% over the same period
- Eastern Region Pre-Disposition Detention ADP remained flat between FY10 and FY13, but youth in detention pending committed placement declined 33%



Eastern Region Committed Youth Population Has Increased Slightly Since FY2010

- Overall daily population of Eastern Region youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement rose from 107 in FY2010 to 121 in FY2013.
- Statewide committed average committed population declined 2% over the same period.
