


Western Region Juvenile Complaints Have Declined Significantly Over Ten Years

- Complaints Referred To DJS Western Region Intake Declined 48% in Ten Years, and 39% just since FY2009
- Statewide Complaints Declined 48% over ten years and 43% since FY2009




The Proportion of Western Region Complaints Referred to Court Has Increased

- 52.2% of Western Region complaints were referred to court by DJS Intake in FY13, 13.1% more than in FY09 Statewide 52% were referred to court, up 10% since FY09
- 24.7% of Western Region complaints were diverted to informal DJS pre-court case, down 5.3% since FY09 Statewide 17.8% were diverted, up just 0.2% since FY09



Western Region Detention Population Has Not Declined Since FY2010

- Overall daily population in detention was virtually the same in FY13 (21.7) as it was in FY10 (21.2)
- Statewide Population Declined 16% over the same period
- Western Region Pre-Disposition Detention ADP increased 18% between FY10 and FY13, but youth in detention pending committed placement declined 38%



Western Region Committed Youth Population Has Remained Flat Since FY2010

- Overall daily population of Western Region youth committed by the juvenile court to out of home placement fluctuated little between FY09 (85 youth) and FY13 (85 youth).
- Statewide committed average committed population declined slightly (2%) over the same period.
